PROGRAM OVERVIEW

EXIT USA *

Exit USA provides structured support for individuals leaving extremist movements in the United States. Through personalized, trauma-responsive guidance, our team helps participants navigate identity transformation, accountability, safety, and reintegration into their communities. By combining professional expertise with lived experience, Exit USA empowers individuals to leave hate behind and build sustainable, positive futures.

THE DAILY FORMER *

The Daily Former explores the journey of leaving extremism and building a new life through firsthand stories, expert insights, and honest conversations. This year, the podcast returned to its compelling storytelling and interview format, with guests from across the spectrum of violence interruption work. This year, TDF produced 21 episodes across two seasons. The focus was on speaking to those who have made it out and are now thriving.

TRAINING & EDUCATION *

Life After Hate provides education and training for therapists, educators, community leaders, and other professionals to identify signs of radicalization and connect individuals to support. Our programs equip participants with evidence-based tools to intervene safely, guide exits from extremist movements, and foster environments where lasting change is possible. PERFORMANCE OVERVIEW

2025 was a year of growing need and growing impact. More people than ever turned to Life After Hate for support, seeking pathways out of violence and extremism. Requests for our programs surged, participation in justice-involved programming rose, and more individuals successfully exited extremist movements. These trends reflect both the effectiveness of our work and the ongoing urgency of our mission.

OUR REACH

More people than ever are turning to Life After Hate for support. This surge in requests reflects growing awareness of our programs and the urgent need for guidance in leaving hate behind. Each request represents an individual seeking a safer path and a chance for transformation.

Justice-involved individuals are engaging with our programs at the highest rate ever. This growth demonstrates that we are meeting a critical need for those navigating accountability, rehabilitation, and reentry, showing that change is possible even in the most challenging circumstances.

More people successfully left extremist movements in 2025 than in 2024. Every exit represents lives redirected toward stability, accountability, and community. This increase reflects both the effectiveness of our programs and the trust our team has built with participants over time.
